Student Government Association Project Proposal

Description

Student Government Association is an organization that has unlimited potential to shape students' lives. If implemented, each student on campus will have a peer representative who will guide them to all appropriate areas where they need help during their time at WTC. Additionally, SGA members are held to a higher standard of student conduct and leadership, and are tasked with the responsibility of leading professional development workshops during the semester where they will assist students on their learning journeys. This will benefit the college community, faculty, and staff, because the high-standard of leadership that SGA preaches will reflect itself on the students, who will implement the professional development skills they learn from our workshops into their classrooms resulting in improved participation and accountability.

SGA will be implemented during the Spring and Fall Semesters. During Spring, the goals will be to provide the professional development workshops, student leadership candidates, ensure a successful round of elections, and state convention attendance. The Fall will see students being met by SGA officers when they move in and given the opportunity to win cool prizes, such as official WTC SGA T-shirts before the semester begins. Entertaining events during the beginning of the semester in August, along with a Halloween-themed event, will enable students to have moments to win prizes, relax, dance, and make new friends.

The program will be evaluated based on: Student Voter Turnout, Student Participation, and Student Opinion. A higher student turnout for SGA elections means students are being engaged through the democratic process and discussing issues concerning the institution of the college itself with their fellow peers. Student Participation includes the turnouts to the professional development workshops. A higher participation from the student body means that

more students are engaged with the campus life, and are more likely to show increased engagement in their classrooms based on what they've learned. Lastly, each of the SGA officers will ensure that the voices of the students are heard. Students who feel their opinions and concerns are being listened to and being met, will be more likely to return to WTC the next year to complete their Associate's Degree. The amount being requested is \$5,000.00 which will be outlined in full below.

Expenses

Elections - \$750 | This amount will cover Campaign Funds (\$300) where each student who is running for an officer position will have funds to purchase campaign materials to promote themselves as a candidate. Food/Snacks (\$100) will be used for students voting during election day on campus, snacks will be provided upon completion of their voting. Election Advertisement (\$250) is reserved for materials such as push cards, posters, social media advertisements, etc. that assist in promoting upcoming elections. SGA Debates (\$100) will provide candidates running for President and Vice-President the opportunity to answer questions from students on campus. The funds are reserved for pushcards, advertisements, etc. that will highlight the individual candidates, similar to a town hall setting.

Branding and Promotion - \$1,000 | This amount consists of a Custom Tablecloth (\$50) that will be used to showcase the SGA at tabling events on and off campus. Social Media Promotion (\$100) includes working with marketing to create an SGA Youtube Channel and FB Page that will help promote the WTC SGA. SGA T-shirts (\$450) are based on \$21.25 each, these will be used mainly as prizes for students on campus during entertainment and professional development. SGA Polos (\$300) are based on \$16.50 each and will be used only for SGA Officers and Student Senators, and will be worn during meetings and official SGA events.

Pushcards (\$100) are going to be used to create custom SGA graphics to hand out to students throughout campus and the dorms.

Student Entertainment & Professional Development - \$1,100 | Beginning in February, SGA will conduct its first of six Professional Development workshops. Each of them utilizing \$100 (\$600 total), that will go towards providing students with handouts, name tags, and prizes. SGA will host one PD event in February, March, and April during the Spring Semester and during September, October, and November during the Fall Semesters. Each of the following PD workshops are as follows: Soft Skills, Personal Branding, Career Survey, Online Portfolio, Personal Development, and Professional Writing Workshops. At the end of the Spring Semester the SGA will host the SGA Awards Ceremony (\$100), where different categories will honor students with certificates and trophies based on student achievements and honor titles. During the Fall Semesters there are two prime entertainment events that will be held: the Fall Semester Welcome Party! (\$200) where funding for prizes, advertisement, and friendly games students can enjoy while they meet each other during the beginning of the semester and the Night of Terrors (\$200), which will include a Halloween-themed event where students will entertain themselves with a costume contest and creative prizes. Funding will go towards advertising, and purchasing Halloween-themed makeup, etc. that will ensure the event is a success for students to experience. SGA Travel - \$1,850 | The primary use for the SGA Travel fund is to ensure each year WTC has a presence at the Texas Junior College Student Government Association Convention. The location of the convention varies year to year, but generally goes with popular metropolitan areas in Texas. Assuming SGA takes 3-5 students, plus two advisors the prices can vary. The TJCSGA convention fund (\$1,500) will cover some of the costs to help get students to the convention. Advisors fees are \$325/each and Students are \$300 each to attend, along with nightly stays at the

hotel which range from \$180-225 a night, depending on location. Generally, the convention requires at least 4 nights of stay, with the final check out day concluding the final events of the convention. This portion of the budget for the project would need to be assisted with some additional funding from Student Activities for Student Senate and Student Travel, if applicable. University SGA Trips (\$350) will fund food costs and other miscellaneous student needs during trips to Texas Tech or other nearby universities.

Dues - \$300 | This final category is for the annual TJCSGA dues that will ensure WTC has a spot in the membership of the state-wide network of advisors and student leaders.
